Clinical Training Program Application

Eligibility Requirements

1. You must abide by the NAADAC Code of Professional Conduct (please refer to the Code of Professional Conduct form).
2. At the time of submitting your application, you must have a bachelor's degree in addiction studies or a closely related field and course work required by the North Dakota Licensing Board, with the exception that two courses may be completed while you are registered as a clinical trainee.
3. You must maintain a 2.0 grade point average in all core courses.

Note: The consortium to which you are applying will determine whether or not you are allowed to complete courses while you are registered as a trainee.

In order for the board to review your application and grant you an interview, you must submit the following items:

- Submit a completed Application for Admission.
- Submit an updated official academic transcript.
- Submit three (3) letters of reference. One letter of reference must be submitted by a professor from your academic institution (please refer to Guidelines for Letters of Reference).
